Acts 5:17-42

1. Chapter 5 vs. 29-32. Have you ever been faced with the choice to obey men or obey God? (John 15:26-27)

Proverbs 17:25-26

1. What does it mean to be foolish? Why should we avoid it?

Psalm 69:16-21

1. What words of praise are offered to the Lord in this Psalm? Do you spend time praising the Lord in prayer before you start making petitions? Spend some time now as a family praising the Lord for His lovingkindness.

1. Re-read verse 9 and ponder it for awhile. Does this God have the same relationship with us?
 - a. 1 Corinthians 1:9
 - b. Romans 8:28
2. How do we gain access to this relationship with God? Have you done so?

1. Chapter 6 vs. 6. The apostles prayed and laid their hands on these men. Was this a new practice?

1. These verses show the wisdom in holding your tongue. Why is it wise to speak less often?

Psalm 69:22-28

1. Many people hated David, and he often asks the Lord to take vengeance upon them. Why do you think David did this? Why do you think the Lord asks us to allow Him to take over this part of our lives?
 - a. Romans 12:19

Deuteronomy 8

1. In Luke 4:4 we see Jesus in the wilderness and He quotes part of Deut. 8:3. What is going on in Luke 4:4?
2. What is the message for us?

1. Chapter 6 vs. 10-13. Does this sound familiar?
 - a. Matthew 26:57-66

Proverbs 18:1-2

1. What two negative qualities are pointed out in these verses? Have you found yourself falling into the patterns? What changes can you make to be more others focused?

Psalm 69:29-36

1. If David, a man after God's own heart, ends his plea to the Lord this way, how should we also end our prayers?

1. In verses 1-2 we see what lies ahead for the nation of Israel as they cross the Jordan River. What is it they face?
2. What does this mean for you and me today?

1. When Stephen is put before the Sanhedrin and questioned (accused) concerning his faith he did not take a defensive attitude, but rather an offensive one, in which he shared his faith. When questioned or accused about your faith which do you tend to do? (offense or defense)

Psalm 70

1. David asks the Lord to "make haste" several times in this Psalm. What do we know about God's timing?
 - a. Acts 1:7
 - b. Matthew 24:42-44
 - c. 2 Peter 3:8-12
 - d. Galatians 4:4

Deuteronomy 10

1. Chapter 10 vs 12-13 According to these verses, what is the essence of the Law?

June 7**Acts 7:37-60**

1. After reading chapter 7, take a look at Ephesians 6:13-18. Was Stephen armed and ready for battle? Are you?
 - a. When you face struggles with others do you consider the spiritual battle that may be at the core of struggle?

Proverbs 18:6-8

1. Once again we see a proverb warning us to use our words wisely. Do you struggle to use your words to help others? Spend time in prayer about this specific issue.

Psalm 71:1-8

1. God is our Rock and our fortress. What question did Peter ask that helps remind us of this?
 - a. John 6:66-69

Deuteronomy 11

1. Chapter 11 Can you share a time that the Lord taught you as He took you through a hard time?

June 8**Acts 8:1-25**

1. Acts chapter 8 vs. 1-3 We see Saul as a man set against the church. Why do you think God chose to use this man the way he did to minister to the church?

Proverbs 18:9

1. What does it mean to be slothful in your work? What kind of a worker are you?

Psalm 71:9-16

1. What kind of words is the psalmist using? Compare that to the many verses in Proverbs that warn against using your words foolishly. Find a proverb about using words wisely and write it down and read it throughout the day.

Deuteronomy 12

1. Chapter 12 vs 5 The Lord gives very specific directions as to where they are to worship Him. What are some acts of worship today that we practice, and where are we to do these acts of worship?

 - b. Ephesians 5:19

1. Acts chapter 8 vs. 30-35 The eunuch was reading the words of Isaiah and wondering about them. The Spirit approached Philip and instructed him to help the guy out. What was Philip's response?

Proverbs 18:10-11

1. Where do you first go for help when you are in any trouble?
 - a. What is one of your favorite names for the Lord?

Psalms 71:17-24

1. David remembers how the Lord had taught him from his youth, and that now he desires to teach others of this generation about the Lord. Who should be doing this teaching to our children?
 - a. Deuteronomy 4:9,10
 - b. Deuteronomy 6:4-9

Deuteronomy 13-14

1. Chapter 13 vs 1-4 The Lord warns them against false prophets. What about us today, is this still a problem in our generation? What does the New Testament say regarding these false prophets?
